SEMMEIWEIS-RICHTER JOURNALISM AWARD

The Semmelweis – Richter Journalism Award aims to honor exceptional journalism that supports women’s health and highlights pharmaceutical advancements in an authentic and accessible way. For this purpose, the Parties have established an international journalism award, and you are informed about the processing of your personal data related to this award in the following privacy notice

I. Joint data controllers, Data Protection Officer (DPO)

as joint data controllers (Richter and Semmelweis hereinafter jointly referred to as “**Data controllers**”),

hereby inform you, as an applicant (hereinafter: Applicant) registering through the website <https://semmelweisrichteraward.com> (hereinafter: Website), about the processing of your personal data related to the Semmelweis-Richter Journalism Award (hereinafter: Award) and the Award Ceremony related to the Award (hereinafter: Ceremony).

II. Information on data processing by purpose

II.1. Submission of Application

How long will we keep your personal data?	Until the withdrawal of consent, but no later than the announcement of the winner.

II.4. Publication winning application work materials on the website

Legal basis for processing your personal data	Legitimate interest of joint controllers [GDPR Article 6(1)(f)]
How long will we keep your personal data?	Five years

II.5. Newsletter (OPTIONAL)

Purposes of data processing	We send newsletters to individuals who subscribe to keep them informed about news.
What personal data do we process about you?	1. Name 2. E-mail address
Legal basis for processing your personal data	Consent [GDPR Article 6(1)(a)]
How long will we keep your personal data?	Until the withdrawal of consent, but no later than five years.

II.6. Taking Photographs at the Award Ceremony

Purposes of data processing	Data Controller's marketing activities related to the Award, promotion of Data controllers' activities and the Award
What personal data do we process about you?	Name, e-mail address
Legal basis for processing your personal data	For group photos, images of individuals on stage, and recordings of the award ceremony: legitimate interest of joint controllers [GDPR Article 6(1)(f)] For individual photos and interviews that do not capture stage appearances: consent [GDPR Article 6(1)(a)]
How long will we keep your personal data?	Until the withdrawal of consent / objection, but no later than five years.

III. Exercisable Data Subject Rights and Remedies

Based on Regulation (EU) 2016/679 of the European Parliament and of the Council (April 27, 2016) on the protection of natural persons with regard to the processing of personal data and on the free movement of such data, and repealing Directive 95/46/EC (hereinafter: "GDPR"), you are entitled to exercise the following data subject rights concerning the personal data processed by Joint data controllers by sending a request to adatvedelem@semmelweis.hu e-mail address.

The following table explains in detail the content of the above-mentioned data subject rights:

Name of data subject right	Content
Right of Access	You have the right to be informed, upon request, whether your personal data is being processed, and if so, to access your processed personal data.
Right to Rectification	You have the right to request the completion of incomplete personal data and the correction of inaccurate personal data.
Right to Erasure	You have the right to request the deletion of your personal data if any of the conditions listed in the referenced article of the GDPR are met.
Right to Withdraw Consent	You have the right to withdraw your consent to the processing of your personal data at any time, and we will delete the personal data processed on this basis. However, the withdrawal of consent does not affect the lawfulness of processing based on consent before its withdrawal.

Right to Restriction of Processing	You have the right to request the restriction of the processing of your personal data if any of the conditions listed in the referenced article of the GDPR are met.
Right to Data Portability	You have the right to receive the personal data you have provided in a structured, commonly used, and machine-readable format, and to transmit those data to another controller without hindrance, if the processing is based on consent or contractual grounds and the processing is carried out by automated means.
Right to Object	You have the right to object at any time, on grounds relating to your particular situation, to the processing of your personal data based on GDPR Article 6(1)(e) and (f), including profiling based on those provisions.

If you, as a data subject, consider that the Joint data controllers have acted unlawfully in the processing of your data, you have the following legal remedies.

Right to an effective judicial remedy against a controller or processor	Article 79 of the GDPR	<p>Without prejudice to any available administrative or non-judicial remedy, including the right to lodge a complaint with a supervisory authority pursuant to Article 77, each data subject shall have the right to an effective judicial remedy where he or she considers that his or her rights under this Regulation have been infringed as a result of the processing of his or her personal data in non-compliance with this Regulation.</p> <p>The case is being dealt with out of turn by the court. You are free to choose whether to bring your action in the court of your domicile (permanent address) or your place of residence (temporary address), or in the court of the court where Richter is based. You can find the court of your domicile or residence at http://birosag.hu/ugyfelkapcsolati-portal/birosag-kereso. The Metropolitan Court of Budapest has jurisdiction to hear the case where Richter is domiciled.</p>
